## TAKE ACTION (Romans 12:10)

Knowing Jesus changes the way you see others, and the way you see yourself too. Instead of seeing yourself as the most important, you realize you should put others first.

All day today, put your focus on others. Instead of taking the bathroom first, let your sister have the mirror. When you want the last bowl of cereal, let your brother have first dibs instead. Instead of waiting for your mom to remind you to pick up your dirty clothes, put them in the hamper on your own.

Ask God to help you see others as worthy of honor.

# DAY 5

- WATCH DAY 5 VIDEO
- COMPLETE DAY 5 DEVOTIONAL

Read Colossians 3: 9-11

Go find the darkest pair of sunglasses you have- maybe you can even borrow some from your mom or dad. Put them on inside and notice how it makes everything look so much closer to the same color. Putting on the glasses gives you a new perspective and makes everything look pretty similar.

Just like today, when Jesus was on the earth, people weren't always great about loving everyone and realizing that everyone is equally loved by God. But Jesus showed us what it means to love each other by the way He treated everyone- Pharisee and sinner, Jew and Gentile, adult and child- the same. And when we follow Jesus, we will see others the way He does: with love for all.

Listen to what God says about His children:

**WE ARE EQUAL IN HIS SIGHT.**

- TAKE ACTION (Ephesians 3: 16-17)

Get permission from an adult to go outside today. Sit really still. What do you hear? What do you see? What do you feel? Is it a windy day? Do you see branches moving? Even if it's a still day, you can probably remember a really windy day and how it felt to have the wind hitting your cheeks.

One of the reasons you can know Jesus so well is because He sent the Holy Spirit to help you understand. When you put your trust in Jesus, the Holy Spirit becomes your helper, to help you trust God no matter what and make wise choices. The Holy Spirit is kind of like the wind. You can't see it, but you can feel the effects. Like when you know you shouldn't do something or when you sense you SHOULD do something. That stirring in your heart is a reminder that even though you can't see Jesus, you can know Him.

Listen for that still, small voice that reminds you that Jesus is with you.

# DAY 2

- WATCH DAY 2 VIDEO

Read Isaiah 43: 18-19

Knowing Jesus changes the way you see everything: even your problems! Instead of focusing on your past, you can look to the future and know that God is going with you. And even if there are some things in your life that have you a little worried, knowing Jesus is with you can change how you see those worries.

Make a list of some of the “pows” you’ve experienced lately—these are hard things you’re facing, or things you’re worried about. Then, think about how those “pows” could be turned into “wows”. Imagine how God will be with you, things He might teach you, experiences you might have. If you can’t imagine how those “pows” might become “wows”, ask Jesus to help you. You can also ask an adult who’s been following Jesus for longer for some help.

## TAKE ACTION! (Psalm 18:2)

With a parent's permission, go outside and find a small rock. Then read Psalm 18:2. Why do you think God calls Himself our rock? Well, He probably wasn't referring to the tiny piece of earth in your hands. But that piece of rock may have once been a part of a much bigger rock, or even a mountain. And when you think about the strength and size of a mountain. God calling Himself our rock makes more sense. If you were alive during biblical times, you also might imagine yourself hiding behind a large rock during a battle, or resting in its shade before there was air conditioning in the hot summer months.

Stick the rock in your pocket or on your dresser to remind you that you can face your fears because God is your rock.

Know God is your place of safety, so you can face your fears.

# DAY 4

- WATCH DAY 4 VIDEO

Read Psalms 56: 3-4

What are your biggest fears? If you're like most people, they probably have a lot to do with other people. Worrying about what other people are doing, or what they're thinking, is normal. But it's not how we should live our lives. When we trust in God, it doesn't matter what others think or say, we can face our fears.

Try to trace the phrase below with a pen or marker, but don't look at the letters as you do it. Instead focus on "your biggest fears". How'd you do?

Now trace the letters again with a different color pen, this time focusing on the letters as you go. It's amazing the difference when you're focused on trusting in God, isn't it?!

TRUST IN GOD

- TAKE ACTION! (Ephesians 4: 22-24)

Knowing Jesus changes the way you see everything, and when you see things differently, you'll live differently. You'll get rid of the old way you used to do things, and you'll follow after God and His ways.

Grab a garbage bag and find a few things in your room that you don't see as useful anymore. Maybe it's some clothes you've outgrown or toys you don't play with anymore. Throw the items in the bag. Then take them to a parent and decide together whether the items should be donated, recycled, or thrown away. As you get rid of the old things, talk to your parent about whether there are some old ways of doing things that you should also get rid of- bad habits, things you do that hurt others or yourself. Ask Jesus to help you embrace all things new! (And a bonus: you'll probably find room in your closet and drawers for some new things there too!)

# DAY 3

- WATCH DAY 3 VIDEO

## Materials

- Hard boiled egg
- Black permanent marker

- 1) After boiling the egg, let it cool and take a look at it. **This egg represents US.**
- 2) **We are not perfect.** We've all done things that are wrong. These are called sins. Sins are things we do hurts God's heart. Doing, saying or thinking bad things are sins. Telling lies, disobeying your parents, hurting others and being selfish are examples of sins. **All of us have sinned.** Using the marker, write down some things you've done wrong on the eggshell.

*Everyone has sinned and fallen short of God's glorious standard.*  
Romans 3:23

- 3) How does the egg look now: Hard? Dirty? Messy? **When we sin, our hearts become stained.** Just like this egg.
- 4) When our hearts become stained by our sins, it prevents us from having a relationship with God. Because of sin, our hearts are no longer clean. **God is perfect: perfectly GOOD and perfectly CLEAN!** Because God is perfectly clean, He can only allow those with clean hearts into heaven. The punishment for our sins is that we can't be with God in heaven.

*The payment for sin is death.*  
Romans 6:32

5) On our own, we can't remove these stains from our hearts. But God loves us so much that He provides a way for our hearts to be made clean. **Our hearts can only be made clean with Jesus' help.** God loves us so much that he sent his son, Jesus, to earth. Jesus was a man who was different from any other person. Jesus is God and never sinned. Jesus came from heaven to earth to take the punishment for our sins. We all deserve to die for our sins, but He took our place. **Jesus died on purpose on the cross so that all the wrong things that we have done can be forgiven.** And on the third day, Jesus became alive again!

*But God shows his great love for us in this way:  
Christ died for us while we were still sinners.*  
Romans 5:8

- 6) When Jesus took the punishment for our sins, something amazing happened. SLOWLY PEEL OFF THE EGG SHELL! How does the egg look now: Soft? Clean? Smooth? In the same way, **when we accept Jesus into our lives, Jesus has the power to remove the stains from our hearts and make our hearts clean.**
- 7) Jesus made it possible for our hearts to be made clean. But before our hearts can be made clean, we need to:
- Admit that we have sinned and ask God to forgive us
  - Believe that Jesus died on the cross to be punished instead of us
  - Commit & invite Jesus into our lives to help us turn away from sin
- 8) When we do these things sincerely, our hearts will be made clean. **When our hearts are made clean, we can be with God and have a relationship with God.** We can become children of God and call God our Father.
- 9) We can one day be with God in heaven and heaven is a wonderful place! There is no sickness, no pain and no hunger. No one dies. Everyone is perfectly happy. The most wonderful thing about heaven is that it is God's home.
- 10) You're invited to pray for forgiveness and for Jesus to come into your life. Saying this prayer means you are truly sorry for all the wrong things you have done. That you truly believe that Jesus took the punishment for your sins. That you truly want to start a relationship with Jesus to help you turn from all the wrong things you have done and do what is right.

## Prayer

Thank you for loving me Jesus. I know that I have sinned. I have done things that are wrong. I believe that you died on the cross to take the punishment for my sins. Please forgive all of my sins. Please come into my life and help me turn away from doing wrong. Thank you that because you took the punishment for my sins, I can have a relationship with you now and will one day be with you in heaven. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.
