Our time in Romania is quickly coming to an end and we wanted to provide you with an update of the last few weeks, as well as what we anticipate upcoming in July and August.

June was a month with a lot of meetings, planning, travel and wrapping up programs. We had a great wrap up event with the Most Klub (Jr High youth program) where we had a meal together



and then went to a concert at a local church. It was a great afternoon, and we have to say that we already miss hanging out with these teens on a frequent basis.

As always, there have been lots of opportunities to preach and serve in churches. I have served in numerous new places in the last few weeks, but one special highlight was traveling to Targu Mures,

a city about three hours from our home. I was

asked to preach at a baptismal service where four people followed the Lord in baptism. It was a great day as we heard their testimonies, watched their baptisms and prayed for them. God is good.

the field directors in Romania returned at the very end of May. We had numerous meetings with them to transition responsibilities back to their portfolio, as well as debrief the last year of ministry in Romania. It is great to have Paul and Tanya back here and to be serving with them for a couple of months together.

In early June, our family traveled into the Ukraine to

visit a displaced persons camp and bring food and hygiene items to them. The facility was an


abandoned hospital that was decommissioned. There was running water, but no heat. This facility largely housed senior women and younger mothers who fled the north western part of Ukraine when the war began. As you can imagine, many of them had stories of significant loss in their lives from the last eighteen months.



We returned to the Ukraine in early July to visit an orphanage that facilitates 130 children. Some of these kids are of Hungarian descent and all have experienced some level of tragedy. We

supplied the government run facility with refrigerators, lawn mowers, food and hygiene items. The buildings were in good repair, and the children appeared to be safe and happy, but funding has been very difficult as most government money in Ukraine is now going to the war effort. We toured the facility, prayed with the staff, delivered our gifts and played with the kids. Before the war this facility housed ninety children, but now with the hiatus on international adoption and the influx of children from other parts of the country, this facility is doing life with more children and a lot less money. 

fondly. We sincerely hope that the Lord opens opportunities in our future to return and to visit people and churches that we love. We are excited about our transition back to full time pastoral ministry in Canada and plan to connect with our new church family at Lake Park Baptist Church in Birch Hills, Saskatchewan numerous times this fall before we fully move by December 1st.

Because we were only on a defined term assignment with the NAB, come August 15 our NAB role is complete. We will be unable to visit most of our supporting churches this fall, even though we wish that we could. If you would like us to come and
