We have been thankful for this intensive time of learning and have really enjoyed getting to know Paul and Tanya. They will be headed to Canada on Wednesday and will be missed by everyone here that knows them. Early in the week we drove through the mountains to a city where a seminary was. We met with a number of Pastors that form the Executive Board for the Hungarian Baptist Convention. 

English, but welcomed people to join in Hungarian if they knew the song. It was rich to hear the congregation at the first church join in their language as we worshiped together. The second church is a small, faithful church of 4.... 4 women that love the Lord and long for their families to understand God's great love for them. Of all the churches we have been to so far, this small group has touched my heart the most. They spoke of love and it seemed to radiate out of them. Please pray for their families and the growth of this church.

Tomorrow we head out near the camp to try and help prepare a home for one of the missionaries to move into. The rest of the team is currently living in the city, however, the plan is for them to move to a property closer to the camp. This is a prayer item as there are still many things that need to happen before they can move... and winter is nearing.



Please also pray for Ian as we get into the swing of things here. He is preparing to lead a team from North America at the end of October. He is also now going to be 'doing the books'... In Canada we have been blessed to have fantastic people doing this for our ministries and so there is a learning curve for him. He is also likely to be preaching 2 or 3 times a Sunday, amongst other things. We are excited for what is to come but the excitement is mixed with a dose of uncertainty!
